Catalyseur du développement du Cameroun à travers ses projets

La Société Nationale des Hydrocarbures (SNH) est une entreprise publique créée le 12 mars 1980, dont le capital est entièrement détenu par l'Etat du Cameroun. Ses missions se déclinent en cinq activités principales :

1. la promotion du domaine minier, en vue de la valorisation des ressources nationales en hydrocarbures ;
2. la négociation et le suivi des contrats pétroliers et gaziers, dans le strict respect des dispositions légales ;
3. la commercialisation des hydrocarbures à l'état brut et le reversement au Trésor public des recettes, qui financent le budget de l'Etat ;
4. la conduite de projets pour la mise en valeur des ressources gazières, afin que le gaz naturel soit véritablement au service du développement du Cameroun ;
5. la gestion des stocks de sécurité des produits pétroliers, pour garantir leur disponibilité en cas d'imprévu majeur.

Le gaz naturel mis au service du Cameroun et des Camerounais

■ Du gaz naturel comme source d'énergie pour les industries

La SNH et son partenaire Gaz du Cameroun ont mis en production les réserves de gaz naturel du champ Logbaba, situé dans la banlieue de Douala, pour approvisionner les industries locales en énergie propre et moins coûteuse que le fioul ou le gasoil. L'unité de traitement de gaz naturel issu de ce champ a été inaugurée par le Président Paul Biya le 15 novembre 2013.

■ Du gaz naturel pour relever l'offre en énergie électrique

La Centrale thermique de Kribi, d'une capacité installée de 216 MW, est alimentée par le gaz naturel provenant du champ Sanaga Sud, exploité par la SNH et son partenaire Perenco. Les livraisons de gaz à la Centrale thermique sont continues depuis le 25 février 2013, via un gazoduc construit et opéré par la SNH. Elles satisfont totalement les besoins exprimés par l'opérateur de cette centrale, qui représente près de 20% des capacités énergétiques nationales.

■ Du gaz domestique pour les ménages, du gaz naturel liquéfié pour l'exportation

2018 est l'année d'entrée du Cameroun dans le cercle restreint des pays exportateurs de gaz naturel liquéfié (GNL), grâce à la mise en place par la SNH et des filiales des groupes Perenco et Golar, d'une usine flottante de liquéfaction de gaz naturel, baptisée Hilli Episeyo. Ce Floating Liquefied Natural Gas (FLNG), issu de la conversion d'un navire, est la toute première unité du genre dans le monde. La production annuelle attendue est de 1,2 million de tonnes de GNL destinées à l'export, 30 000 tonnes de gaz domestique (GPL) destinées au marché local et 1,8 million de barils de condensats destinés à la raffinerie.



L'entretien du capital santé au cœur de notre politique RSE



L'entretien du capital humain constitue l'un des axes majeurs de la politique de responsabilité sociétale de SNH. Outre la disponibilité des médecins d'entreprise sur tous les sites d'activité, une police assurance maladie a été souscrite pour l'ensemble des agents. De plus, des visites médicales systématiques sont organisées annuellement pour maintenir le personnel en bon état de santé. Par ailleurs, la SNH dispose de Comités Santé et Sécurité au Travail. Ces comités veillent au respect des normes de santé et d'hygiène sur tous les sites de l'entreprise.

COURSE PRESENTATION

-I HYSTEROSCOPY

This course, partly theoretical and hands on, will provide the participants with a variety of techniques both out patients and in patient on how to use the technique of hysteroscopy for diagnosing and operating. It will provide the participants with the knowledge of the See and Treat techniques. It will get the participants acquainted with the technique of hysteroscopic tissue morcellation so that operative gestures can be accomplished without the use of electric energy in the uterine cavity hence reducing the collateral damage caused by electricity. It will allow the participants to discover the hysteroscopes by handling these whilst assembling. The hands on will allow for getting the correct bearings in entering the cervical canal and manoeuvring inside the uterine cavity whilst tackling anatomical impediments.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

At the conclusion of the course the participants will :

1. Be aware of the diagnostic possibilities of the hysteroscopic technique.
2. Be aware of what problems can be solved in the See and Treat settings in out-patients.
3. Be aware of the difference between the classical electro resection and the tissue removal through morcellation.

PG II VAGINAL AND LAPAROSCOPIC HYSTERECTOMY

During this one day course, theoretical sessions will alternate with live theatre work. Internationally renowned gynaecological surgeons will illustrate the technique of vaginal hysteroscopy and laparoscopic hysterectomy. They will demonstrate the techniques during live interventions in theatre with a two-way sound so that the participants will be able to ask questions. The experts will point out the preferred way of performing hysterectomy by the majority of the surgeons whilst indicating that vaginal hysterectomy is less painful for the patient. They will indicate on evidence based level what the less expensive type of hysterectomy means for the community and the patient.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

By the end of this one day course the participants will :

1. Be aware of the techniques to perform vaginal and laparoscopic hysterectomy.
2. Be aware of the costs of the different types of hysterectomy.
3. Know the indications and contraindications to perform both types of hysterectomy.

PG III SEBCOH-I

This course is conceived in coordination with the Academy and with the logistical help of MedCollege. The exercises performed by the participants are part of the certification in eye hand coordination (Screen Eye Brain Coordination

with Handheld-instruments SEBCOH-i)) necessary to continue with the further steps of the ISGE Accreditation. The LASTT consists of exercises which test the ability to use a 30° and a 0° scope in different exercises within a set time frame using classical laparoscopic instruments.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

At the end of this course the candidates will know if their hand – eye coordination is sufficient to start the curriculum to become a Master Endoscopic Surgeon following the different steps of the ISGE Accreditation.

PG IV NURSES

This theoretical course is conceived for the theatre nurses. The participants will gain knowledge in bringing patients to theatre, to install the patients on the operating table, to be proficient in theatre using the different spaces to set tables and accommodate the surgeons. The participants will be taught to set the instruments and the endoscopic hardware including pump systems, photographic and video equipment, energy generators and their settings.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

At the end of this course the participants will have gained basic knowledge of bringing patients into theatre and installing them on the operating table. They will know how to use the theatres ergonomically, to set up the instrument tables for endoscopic surgery. They will have basic knowledge to use the pump systems, photographic and video modules and energy generators. They will have basic knowledge on the use of electrical energies, monopolar and bipolar, in theatre both hysteroscopy and laparoscopy.

PG V LAPAROSCOPIC SUTURING

The aim of this course is for the participants to learn theoretical explanations to perform hands-on intra and extra corporeal knotting in a pelvitrainer with specifically designed needle holders and endoscopic instruments.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

At the end of this course that participants will have the basic knowledge on how to perform endoscopic knots both intra- and extra-corporeal. The endoscopic knots are the basic surgeon's knots and double hitch. The participant will be able :

- 1) to explain how to overcome the obstacles to laparoscopic suturing and knot tying in relation to depth perception and port placement
- 2) reproduce efficient techniques for tissue approximation, suture management and running closures,
- 3) recognise and perform efficient intra-corporeal and extra-corporeal knot tying, recognize common mistakes encountered and how to correct them.

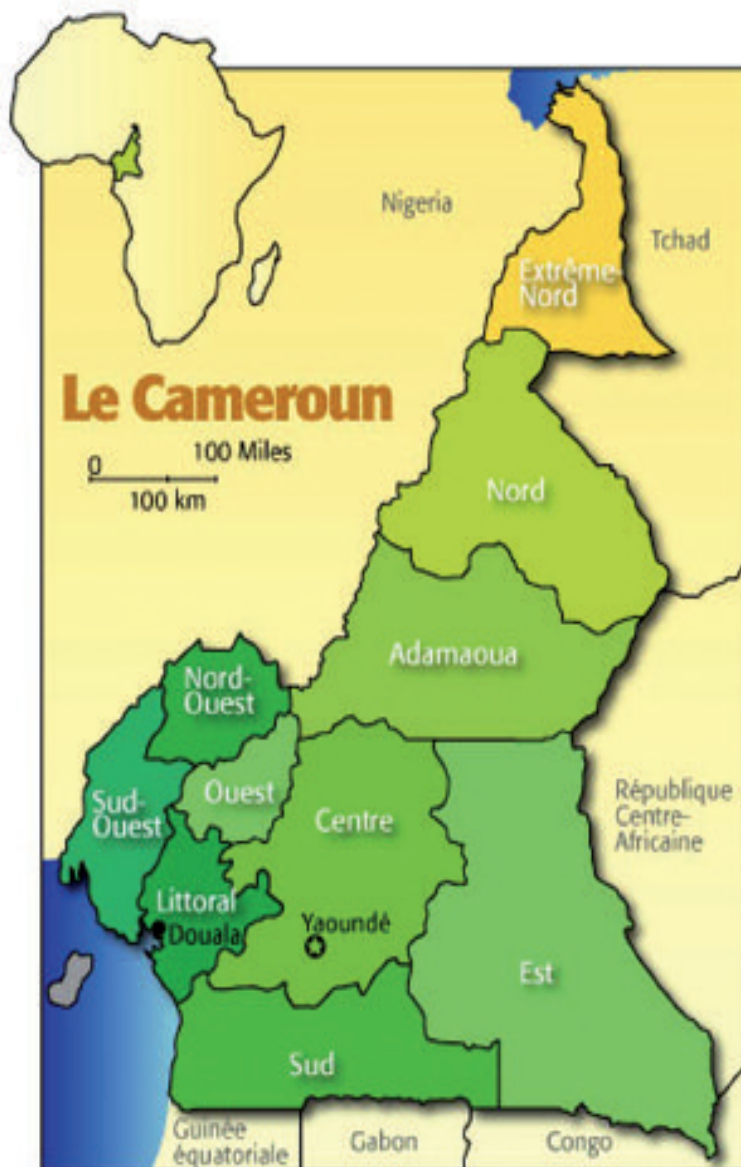
Cameroon which is located in the Gulf of Guinea on the western face of Africa, has 590 km of coastlines over the Atlantic ocean. As far as its shape is concerned, it looks like a triangle of which the base spreads over the 2nd degree of northern latitude, whereas the peak reaches the 13th parallel. The country has the 9th highest mountain of the continent, Mount Cameroon which is 4.070 m high.

The Southern part is characterized by an equatorial climate with dense forests. Rubber, palm oil, cocoa and tea are the main crops. The Western part has a mild climate, rounded mountains and fertile lands. It is the breadbasket of Central Africa. In the Centre, we have the vast Adamawa Plateau whose altitude is comprised between 1.000 and 1.500 m, descending in gentle slopes towards the Sanaga River which is the main river of the country. In the Northern part, a deep and rugged fault leads to the Benoue Valley, the weather being hot and dry. The landscape is covered with savannahs and the Mandara Mountains. The dense forest and the savannah are full of fauna protected in nature reserves, Waza being the largest one.
